


MEANINGFUL


- State Assessment meet or exceed the graduation scores in the Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) in English and Math
- Dual Credit Earn at least one high school credit in English and high school credit in math dual credit courses such as Running Start
- SAT/ACT Meet or exceed the graduation scores set by the state in the math and english portions of the SAT or ACT
- ASVAB Meet standard on the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) by scoring the minimum established by the military for eligibility to serve
- CTE SEQUENCE Complete an approved sequence and Technical (CTE) courses

What is the High School & Beyond Plan?


- The High School and Beyond Plan (HSBP) is a graduation requirement for every student.
- It's a process for students, parents and teachers to guide students to think about their future.




- Plans are personalized and designed to help students set, visualize and work to achieve goals

- World Class Scholars (WCS)
 Pays for first year at Grays
 Harbor College and is honored for up to 25 months after graduation
- Students can sign up for WCS online
- Students must graduate HS
 with a minimum 3.0 GPA,
 complete 40 hours of
 community service, and
 demonstrate a variety of
 interpersonal skills, including
 working with groups,
 leadership roles and respecting
 others





- The College Bound
 Scholarship (CBS) is an
 early commitment of state
 financial aid to eligible
 students who meet the
 pledge requirements
- Students are automatically enrolled in CBS based on Application for Free and Reduced Lunch
- CBC covers average tuition at public college rates
- Students must maintain at least a 2.0 and qualify based on income determined by FAFSA completion
